
JUNE SPEAKER

Our speaker for May failed to turn up and Max requested that members with an interesting story might like to share it with us.

Duncan Forbes told us of an early expedition with his wife Cath and their young daughters to all places north. They drove to Port Augusta and put the car and camping gear on the train to Alice Springs, then a detour south to Uluru and climb "The Rock".

Then heading north up to Darwin and flights to Kununurra and over Kakadu before the long haul East

through Mount Isa to Towns-ville where the car needed some TLC. This was a very adventurous and exciting trip for a young family.



Ken Pryor was brought up in a small country town near the Mount Morgan goldmine in the Rockhampton Region of Queensland. Ken spoke about Mount Morgan's rich and famous and what they did with their wealth. William Knox D'Arcy was a major share-holder and went via England to search for oil in the Middle East and with support from Winston Churchill eventually became involved in founding what was to be BP Petroleum. Also from Mount Morgan, Walter Hall's wealth was put to good use by his wife founding the Walter and Eliza Hall Institute of Medical Research.

Max Smedley spoke about a highlight of one of his trips, sailing through the 77 km Panama Canal. After being held up at Los Angeles airport they missed their flight to San Diego which caused some concern but ended up a blessing as they were driven to San Diego and negotiated with the driver to take them direct to the dock. There are two canals (more built after Max was there) where the locks raise the water level over the range. The water supply comes from the huge man-made Gatun Lake some 24 km long. Thanks guys for a very interesting morning.

A secret airfield east of Marble Bar for long range B-24 Liberator heavy bombers. 25 Squadron RAAF and the 380th US Bomber Group of the American 5th Air Force operated successfully against Japanese held targets and shipping. Also operating there was #7 Communications Unit with our Jack O'Hara, who was one of the last handful of servicemen leave Corunna Downs at war's end.

Ken presented Jack with Antonio Caferella's book "Corunna Downs - The Invisible WW2 Airfield". Nice touch Ken.

Duncan Forbes was pleased to announce that the National Boer War Association have finally achieved their aim of installing a Boer War Memorial in the Nation's Capital. The memorial was dedicated on May 31 at the site in Anzac Parade, Canberra. Volunteers had raised \$4 million for the memorial which depicts four troopers mounted on horseback. Duncan's father was in the 5th Victorian Mounted Regiment. Thanks for the news Duncan, it's been a long campaign.
