SEPTEMBER SPEAKER

The speaker was Jennifer Huxley, a Diversional Therapist from Merri Health, was supported by a colleague, Stefanie Pelligrino. Her subject was suggestions in writing a "Lifebook" which is apparently the modern buzzword for autobiography. However before she commenced she gave a hint on chronic pain control which many old patients experience:

"Chronic pain is like 'cold' in that it can be put into the background, and perhaps concentrating on writing may help with this"



On writing she suggested several thoughts as a guide:

Life experiences should be written down for the interest of family and friends; Confidence will come when the project is started;

Stimulation can come from writing the first trial sentences;

You will gain benefits in writing your life experiences by gaining confidence; building relationships, finding that some siblings may share experiences but have different results.

Start with one part of your life, then other parts will follow;

Always have a pen and notebook handy to record your thoughts when the memory occurs, the sequence can be sorted later. Computers make this much easier in transferring passages from one pert to another, but it can be done the oldfashioned-pen-and-ink method.

Not owning a computer is not an excuse for putting off starting your project; Previous events in memory are now seen with 'older' eyes.

Suggested topics

These can cover birth; parents; siblings; education; childhood; cars; boats; pets; hobbies; and sports. (You will certainly think of more!)

Your favourite things can provide topics, eg flowers, colour, books, your one wish. How you wish to be remembered can also create suitable subjects.

Photos can provide stimulation for thoughts and can be included in your project.

Your writing can be handwritten; typed; computer generated; or even professionally

copied and bound.

The number printed is probably frequently underestimated, but if only a small number is required it is still well worthwhile.

Finally Jenny noted that many personal writings are done by aged care residents as

regrettably so many stories are not shared with families earlier.

This is really a compelling reason for starting yours now.
