OCTOBER SPEAKER

Our speaker for October was Amy Sharpe, the Lead Communicator for the Greater Metropolitan Cemeteries Trust .

Established as a Class A Cemetery Trust in 2010, it is regulated under the *Cemeteries and Crematoria Act 2003 (Vic)*, and accountable to the Department of Health, via the Minister for Health. It manages nineteen cemeteries and two greenfield sites (still farms). It's Headquarters is at the Fawkner site.



Located in Melbourne's north, Fawkner Memorial Park was established in 1906 and features extensive grounds, waterways and ornamental gardens. It covers over 113 hectares and was designed by renowned landscape architect Charles Heath, it is intersected by Merlynston and Campbellfield Creeks, and is serviced by the Upfield train line. The Fawkner Memorial Park Tea Rooms offer refreshments for visitors, and the cemetery's wide, shady boulevards provide a peaceful landscape for remembrance and reflection.

With a crematorium, chapels and function facilities, Fawkner Memorial Park plays an important role in the communities it serves. It was the first in Australia to introduce grand public mausolea, and is home to the Holy Family Mausoleum and Holy Angels Mausoleum.


The Trust is making use of digital technology to show history in a new light. For people with Smart Phones the Discover Cemeteries Application is available from the App Store or Google Play. The app allows you to wander newly created Cemetery Virtual Tours and at each "story point" on your journey you will hear previously untold tales about the people and their history.

People like Dorothy Knapp who was Fawkner's first burial or Kathleen Best, a war hero and trail blazer of Australian Women's Army Corp. Stand on the actual site and see the Mortuary Train arrive at the station. Some graves are unmarked but you will know you are in the right place when you feel your phone buzz and see a Discover Cemeteries sign. For more information go to gmct.com.au/discover-cemeteries.

Over the last 2 months we have read 'Cloud Cuckoo Land' by Anthony Doer. This novel follows five characters whose stories, despite spanning nearly six centuries, are bound together by their interest in an ancient manuscript.

The book that we have chosen to read in November is 'The Book Thief' by Markus Zusak. The novel starts in Nazi Germany shortly before World War 2 and tells the story of a young girl, Liesel, who picks up a book hidden in the snow by her brother's graveside. Soon she is stealing books from Nazi book-burnings, the mayor's wife's library, wherever there are books to be found. So begins a love affair with books and words, as Liesel, with the help of her foster father, learns to read. After encouragement from a Jew that her family is hiding in a basement, Liesel writes the story of her life. She is the only survivor of an air raid that kills her family and everyone else on her block and the tale shows what it was like for many, and how serious war was and still is.
